The hotel is a member of Leading Hotels of the World and during its closure, the team, including butlers, underwent extensive service training led by new operations manager Mark Murraybrown.

Olivier Trinquand, vice president, The Strand Hotel & Cruise, said: "The Strand Yangon was one of the first luxury colonial outposts in southeast Asia, founded in 1901 by famous hoteliers, the Sarkies brothers. It remains one of the most architecturally beautiful landmarks in the region and this latest project has preserved the heritage at the heart of the hotel."

Meanwhile, The Strand Cruise is planning to launch a series of special cruises in 2017, covering music, culinary and photography themes.
