ASIA

MEKONG

1. See red (in a good way)

Over the past couple of decades, the Pandaw portfolio has grown from a single converted Clyde-built steamer ship to 17 hand-crafted brass and teak vessels that sail into some of Asia's most interesting and off-the-beaten-track corners. This itinerary tacks on a Red River cruise in northern Vietnam to a journey along the upper Mekong through Laos, Thailand and Myanmar to make an unforgettable 21-day expedition trip. Destinations include Halong Bay and Hanoi (Vietnam), the Golden Triangle in northern Thailand and the Unesco World Heritage city of Luang Prabang (Laos).

2. A new jewel

Constructed using sustainable materials, the new Mekong Jewel is Uniworld's most ecofriendly build yet. This is a luxurious all-suite ship with an impressive pool, gym, library and two Royal Suites (924 sq ft) with stunning balconies. For less humid evenings, there is also an al fresco dining area on the sun deck. Cruises are combined with city stays in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, and Siem Reap, Cambodia, and include a visit to Angkor Wat. The operator partners with the charitable organisation Pack for a Purpose and encourages passengers to help designated Mekong communities by packing a few useful supplies.

3. Explore the Mekong

The river-cruise market in Asia is flooded with luxury options. If you're after something more wallet-friendly, The River Cruise Line's new cruise in Cambodia and Vietnam should fit the bill. The ship, the four-star Indochine, visits the Mekong Delta and Cambodia's Tonle Sap lake, where stops are made at stilt villages. The cruise can be combined with an onward rail tour in Vietnam to make a 21-day Far Eastern adventure. The RV Indochine has just 24 cabins, each with large windows and there's a large sun deck for panoramic views.

4. Magnificent China

Although China is off limits to tourists at the moment due to the coronavirus outbreak, a journey along the Yangtze River often forms part of itineraries that make the best of China's diverse attractions. When the country once again opens it doors, options include Wendy Wu's 22-day trip that visits Xian for the Terracotta Warriors, the Three Gorges dam and Chengdu for an evening at the opera and a visit to the Panda Conservation Centre. You will also visit Beijing and Shanghai and enjoy a cruise along the Li River from Guilin, to charming Yangshuo. The river's cormorant fishermen and dramatic karst peaks have been an artist favourite for centuries.

5. Monkey business

For many, a holiday to Asia is as much about the food experience as the sights. On this family-friendly cruise along the Yangtze – again subject to the ending of the coronavirus

outbreak – there is the opportunity for some hands-on tuition in Chinese dumplingmaking on board the Yangtze Explorer. During a visit to the Shennongjia Nature Reserve, watch golden snub-nosed monkeys (as seen on the BBC's Seven Worlds, One Planet) swinging between branches, and ask questions over lunch at Xiaolongtan, a wildlife rescue centre.

6. Water festival

Plying the waterways of Myanmar's Ayeyarwady River between the ancient capitals of Bagan and Mandalay, The Strand Cruise is styled after its sister property, the culturally significant Strand Yangon (Kipling and Orwell are among those who have called its hallowed rooms home). The evocative bygone-era character of the hotel is echoed in the elegant 50-passenger ship, which has a sun deck, stylish pool and spa. The Strand Cruise sails on two, three and four-night itineraries from Mandalay. This year the April departure happens to coincide with one of the most significant cultural and religious festivals in the Buddhist calendar, New Year, which is welcomed in with a water festival. Thingyan is a four-day celebration that combines religious observance with a good dowsing which, according to tradition, cleanses ready for the coming year. Expect to get wet!

7. Incredible India

With the opportunity to spot the greater one-horned rhino and visit several of the state's national parks, a river cruise in Assam in north-eastern India has much to offer the naturalist. Noble Caledonia has combined the cruise on board the 34-passenger RV Charaidew II, which launched last year, with hotel nights at the Oberoi in Kolkata and the option to extend the holiday with a side-trip to Bhutan. There's plenty to learn from expert guides along the route, and several Hindu monasteries and an ancient capital city are among the ports of call.

8. Give back while you cruise

Sustainability is something many of us consider when booking an overseas trip. Air miles, the impact our holiday has on local resources and the interaction with the local community are key considerations. When booking, read the small print and ask the cruise line if there is anything you can take with you. Some encourage their passengers to take stationery for schools; others support local charities and offer excursions that facilitate volunteering. On the Hooghly River in India, Responsible Travel donates 5 per cent of the cruise fare towards a charitable foundation that seeks to positively impact lives and livelihoods through education, the environment and rural community development. The ship's guides are local and act as ambassadors in their own villages for issues around poaching, plastic bag usage and environmental stewardship. Ships are panelled with bamboo (a more sustainable wood) and simply but comfortably furnished. The 22-passenger ship sails from Kolkata to Farakka to Kolkata, calling at riverside villages and visiting several little-known Bengali terracotta temples.

9. Echoes of wartime history

Taking in two very different rivers and two diminutive ships, this quirky itinerary from Audley Travel throws a light on central Thailand. The elegant and colonial-style RV River Kwai takes 20 passengers along the jungle-clad River Kwai to Kanchanaburi, where a museum details the moving history of the Thailand-Burma railway. An Allied cemetery honouring British POWs held here by their Japanese captors is not far away. Passengers swap ships in Bangkok for a cruise along Bangkok's main arterial waterway, the Chao Phraya, to the ancient capital of Ayutthaya. The eight-person Anantara Dream is a faithful restoration of a former rice barge.

10. Out of Africa

An average day meandering the channels of Lake Kariba in southern Africa might bring sightings of basking crocodiles, hippos and elephants. But you'll see an awful lot more on CroisiEurope's The Ends of the Earth itinerary with an extension to Cape Town and the Cape of Good Hope. Throughout the journey, you will enjoy spotting a great variety of wildlife. You will also embark on a number of safari experiences – both on the water and on land – as you make your way through four different countries. The majority of cruising is done on board the brand-new Zimbabwean Dream. Highlights of the trip include cruising on the Gache Gache and Zambezi rivers, game-spotting in Matusadona National Park on the shore of Lake Kariba, a visit to Impalila Island in Namibia and an optional flight over Victoria Falls.

The opportunity to combine a Nile cruise with a visit to neighbouring Israel is rather unusual but Emerald Waterways is offering just that on a new itinerary that travels from Tel Aviv to Cairo via a slew of fascinating historical cities and sights. Highlights include a cruise along the Sea of Galilee, a tour of Jerusalem's beguiling Old Town and a visit to the ancient temples of Ramesses II in Egypt's Valley of the Kings. The cruise is aboard the MS Hamees.

Luxury line Uniworld is set to launch a new ship on the Nile in August, the SS Sphinx. The 42-suite Sphinx is a good option for those wishing to spend a bit more time on the river, as she will sail on 12-day round-trip cruises from Cairo, where passengers spend two nights at the Four Seasons hotel. The cruise runs the gamut of sights including temples dedicated to Hathor and Hatshepsut as well as the Valley of the Kings. Giza's Grand Egyptian Museum is due to open in October.

13. A rare passion

The Oberammergau Passion Play is a decennial event, which has been performed since the 17th century, and a handful of operators have bagged some of those once-in-adecade tickets for passengers this summer. This journey through four countries, from the Alps to the Black Sea through the scenic Wachau Valley, is a perennial favourite among river cruisers. Activities include city tours and a tour of Melk Abbey. This year's Passion Play will involve active participation from more than 2,300 locals, ranging from infants to 96-year-old Anni Drohmann.

14. Balkan gems

River cruises to the Balkans have proved so popular for APT that the operator has added several more departure dates for this summer. Itineraries now include a journey to the Godollo Palace in Hungary on board the Grand Empress, a restored steam train once used by Emperor Franz Josef and his wife Sisi. Balkan Gems takes guests down a less visited stretch of the Danube from Budapest to Giurgiu, in southern Romania. In Pecs, there is a chance to view the ceramics collection of Laszlo Gyugyi.

15. Tales of empire

In a region endowed with picturesque riverside towns and villages, not to mention some of the world's prettiest perched castles, it's easy to overlook the more ancient historical significance of some of Europe's river-cruise favourites. Archaeological specialist Andante Travels has teamed up with A-Rosa to offer an in-depth look at the former Roman province of Pannonia, bound on the north and east by the Danube. An expert historian will accompany passengers on visits to two former capitals of Roman Pannonia – Carnuntum (near Vienna) and Aquincum (near Budapest) – and to Devin Castle, which dates back to the Neolithic period. On board the A-Rosa Donna, more tales of the Roman empire can be gleaned during early-evening lectures.

Finding new experiences on return visits to a favourite region or country can be tricky. Jules Verne's Secrets collection has been created with this in mind. A new Secret Danube itinerary delves into the Austro-Hungarian and Ottoman empires, travelling via capitals that were once behind the Iron Curtain and visiting places including Constanta/Tulcea, Bucharest, Veliko Tarnovo, Ruse, the Iron Gates, Belgrade/Novi Sad and Osijek. At the Black Sea, the river widens into the marshy, tree-fringed lakes, reed islands and forests of the Danube Delta, possibly one of the well-travelled river's bestkept secrets.

The high standards found across the board on river ships means that there's very little compromise, even if you are looking for a more affordable holiday. The Polaris is the first of three contemporary ships being rolled out within APT's Travelmarvel brand. The ship offers several places to dine, including a terrace and roof garden and has stylish relaxation areas and light-filled cabins, some with Juliet balconies. Perfect for admiring the Rhine Gorge and the string of hilltop castles that line the river.

Bonn's beloved Beethoven will be the centre of attention later this year when Europewide celebrations take place to mark the German composer and pianist's 250th anniversary. Mustard tasting is a must, but there's another reason to visit Dijon this year: its Musée de Beaux-Arts has reopened following a major refurbishment.

Sailing from Avignon to Marseillan (where Noilly Prat produces its famous Vermouths), highlights include a tour of Arles, a private tasting at the vineyards of Châteauneuf-du-Pap and a mooring at the striking walled town of Aigues-Mortes, in the Camargue.

A cruise through Normandy will visit the gardens at Giverny, Normandy's Second World War beaches and the magnificent chateau of Les Andelys.

28. Tui moves to rivers

Tui enters the river-cruise arena this summer with three ships and flexible pricing that lets passengers choose how "inclusive" they would like their cruise to be. Instead of paying for excursions up front you can bolt on as many or as few as you like. The same goes for drinks on board. This brings the lead-in price for a cruise from Amsterdam to Frankfurt on board Tui Isla to just under £1,500pp.

While the United States has very few cruisable rivers the ones it does have certainly pack a punch. The most famous of course is the Mississippi, which snakes its way through several states. The newest paddlewheel ship on the river, the American Countess, will sail on her inaugural voyage in April. In contrast to the showboat-style interiors that have characterised the previous three ships in the American Queen Steamboat Company fleet, the Countess does away with chintz in favour of a modern look. The ship will, of course, retain the trademark ketchup-red paddlewheel.

Picture the Pacific north-west of America and forest, salmon fishing, mountain peaks and grizzlies might come to mind. Tracing the tracks of explorers Lewis and Clark, who set off to "discover" the region in 1804, the four-deck paddlewheel ship American Empress sails on the Columbia and Snake rivers between Portland, Oregon and Clarkston in Washington State. In that same spirit of adventure, passengers on board the Empress can now participate in fun and active experiences that showcase the region's spectacular wilderness. There's family friendly ziplining in the forests of Oregon, fishing on the Columbia river and, on the Snake river, a scenic jet boat ride into Hell's Canyon – so formidable that even Lewis and Clarke took a detour. The canyon is home to thousands of native plants, rare birds and wildlife including bighorn sheep, elk, mule deer, mountain lion and black bear. Best leave those alone.
